- 11** Untranslatable Martian word in 60s sci-fi classic *Stranger in a Strange Land* by Robert A. Heinlein appropriated by IT nerds into lexicon computer science
- 13** Oscar Madison *or* Olivier Messiaen (initials)
- 14** Towering Collingwood legend known for famous run and goal in final moments of 1964 Grand Final (on *YouTube*) (nickname)
- 15** *Veronicas* album (initials)
- 16** Instructs or improves morally or intellectually
- 18** Nightmarish cartoon character conceived by Ed “Big Daddy” Roth as insane, drooling, drug addicted, biker, anti-Mickey Mouse

- 1** Thing causing intense emotional distress in young
- 2** Elia Kazan *or* Eddie Kendricks *or* Ernst Kaltenbrunner *or* Erich Korngold (initials)
- 3** Sudden, forceful, contempt-filled dismissal terminating encounter by instructing antagonist to leave (vulg.) (4, 3)
