<sup>1</sup> “We have all experienced moments...when it suddenly becomes perfectly obvious that life is infinitely fascinating. It is almost as if some other person - a more powerful and mature individual - has taken over my mind. This higher self views my problems and anxieties with kindly detachment, but entirely without pity. Looking at my problems through his eyes, I can now see that I was a fool to worry about them. If I could remain in this state all the time - or at least, summon it at will - life would be a continual adventure. And this is the maddening absurdity.
