- 27 Oblique, implied, circuitous, ancillary, veiled
- 28 Enigmatic empire between Caspian and Black Sea known for mass conversion in 8th century to Judaism constituting, with subsequent migration west into Europe, the non-Semitic antecedents of Ashkenazi Jewry in anti-Semitic conspiracy theory involving delegitimization of Jewish State and clear genocidal agenda
- 30 Hyman Roth (initials)
- 31 Rhode Island (initials)
- 32 *Bab* ... One of seven Roman gates of old city of Damascus dedicated by Byzantines to Apostle Thomas (ثوما) (previously Venus)
- 34 Who can you trust? (2-3)
- 37 Best known depressed salesman in American theatre
- 38 Iconic role of reclusive actress Tina Louise (7, 5)

- 1 Celebrated artist known for portraits of notable Australians and ebullient bohemian life in Eltham
- 2 Fever (archaic) (“They told me I was everything: ‘tis a lie, I am no ...-proof. To see the things thou dost not. To this great stage of fools. Their going hence, even as their coming hither” *King Lear*)
- 3 Inducing excitement and desire for something esp. when unobtainable (from character in Greek myth doomed to eternity of insatiable desire)
- 4 Latin prefix meaning sharp, acute, acid, pointed (cephalic, moron, *Contin* etc.)

- 15 *Alvin Purple* (initials)
- 18 Hero of ripping Wagnerian opera about ghostly sea captain cursed for invoking Satan to sail endlessly with chance every seven years to come ashore to find love redemption through love
- 20 German singer known for apocalyptic, anti-war classic about 99-year war (“Neunundneunzig Jahre Krieg ließen keinen Platz für Sieger”) from 80s
- 22 Death metal subgenre known for Nordic themes *Bathory, Enslaved, Amon Amarth, Falkenbach, Barbariön* (from Brunswick) etc.
- 23 “... bin ein Berliner” (“I am a donut”) JFK
- 24 102 (Roman numerals)
- 29 Tragic character played by Richard Davalos in *East of Eden* with haunting final scene depicting descent into madness of formerly pacifistic “good” son, with mind shattered after revelation by “bad” son Cal (James Dean) about mother, leaving on train to enlist in army in First World War (first name)
- 35 Coarse way of getting someone’s attention
- 36 Eight Elvises *or* erectus erectus (initials)
