- 26** Torrid, pre-code 1932 movie directed by Lewis Milestone set in South Seas with Walter Huston as repressed missionary and Joan Crawford as prostitute he desires
- 30** Mysterious garment worn by Jesus in 1953 Cinemascope Biblical epic with Richard Burton as riven Roman tribune assigned to Crucifixion, Victor Mature as defiant Greek slave and Michael Rennie radiant in role of Saint Peter
- 33** Edgar Bergen, Ron Blaskett, Maxwell Frere, Chuck Campbell etc.
- 36** Volcanic Galilean moon of Jupiter named after maiden ravished by Zeus disguised as cloud
- 37** Grueling, 60-hour, human potential seminar devised by Walter Hans Erhard (formerly John Rosenberg) in 70s
- 38** Early German cruise missile or "flying bomb" deployed in air war with Britain known by Allies as a "doodlebug" (or "buzz bomb") and in Germany as Vergeltungswaffe ("revenge weapon") (1-1)

- 60** Greatly loved, 13th century Persian poet and Sufi mystic known for mystical aphorisms such as الجرح هو المكان الذي يدخل منه النور إليك etc.
- 61** Greatly loved Merchant/Ivory film version of E. M. Forster novel memorable for beauty of Florentine locations, breakout performance of Helena Bonham Carter as adorable heroine Lucy Honeychurch and genitals of Simon Callow (in role of Reverend Mr. Beebe)
- 7** Someone acclaimed for outstanding talent or cultural impact who transcends their field becoming a universal symbol such as Weary Dunlop, Muhammed Ali or Warnie
- 8** Lonely butcher played by Ernest Borgnine in Paddy Chayevsky film about little people
- 9** Beautiful European city known for medieval spires, legend of the Golem and moody *INXS* videos in 80s

- 28** Largely forgotten Soviet cosmonaut and second person (after Yuri Gagarin) to orbit earth on Vostok 2 in 1961
- 29** Group or conclave of witches as depicted in 1928 *Häxan* or arresting finale of *The Witches* as innocent Puritan girl (Anya Taylor Joy) embraces Satan
- 31** Japanese TV actor at centre of Shintaromania associated with bubblegum cards and backyard injuries involving homemade beer can top star knives (in 60s)
- 32** Babylonia Talmud *or* Bud Tingwell (initials)
- 34** Rabbi Shmuley *or* Red Square (initials)
- 35** Life force in Chinese philosophy and medicine regarded as the intrinsic, vital energy flowing through all living things and the universe and excellent word in *Scrabble*TM

- 42** Controversial Chinese artist known for destroying Han dynasty pottery and posing as drowned Syrian child on beach (3-3)
