- 30 Papal name (since c.140) inc. XII known for wartime "silence" and XIII (Earl Pulvermacher) elected in Montana in 1998 by schismatic sedevacantist conclave regarding popes after XII heretics due to sin of modernism and the holy seat, as a result, "vacant" since 1958
