- 11** German Cold War Soviet satellite state
- 12** Onomatopoeic word for bleat
- 13** Female lead role in *Der fliegende Holländer* by Richard Wagner with moving ballad
- 15** One of the twelve tribes of Israel rewarded for especial zeal in conquest of Canaan with large territory east of the Jordan
- 17** Danny Zuko *or* Dr. Zaius (initials)
- 18** Sitting around doing nothing
- 19** Greek Bronze Age city with famous lion gate
- 21** Grammatical article in English denoting a thing already mentioned, implied or otherwise presumed familiar to listeners or readers
- 23** Affectionate Australian hypocorism
- 24** Bible book which begins "Everything is so meaningless. The Teacher says that it is all a waste of time!" (in *Holy Bible: Easy-to-Read Version*)
- 29** Salty fish eggs enjoyed by Greeks
- 30** Extract metal from ore with heat
- 31** Richard Evans (initials)
- 32** Italian saint and martyr beheaded by Romans for purity with baroque cathedral in Piazza Navona containing skull

- 34** Biblical home of Job
- 35** Adam Troy (initials)
- 36** Industrial region in West Germany destroyed by British in Operation *Chastise* with famous "bouncing bombs" of Barnes Wallis
- 39** Popular name of modernist sculpture *Vault* by Ron Robertson-Swann removed in disgrace from City Square in 1978 after display of aesthetic outrage from Melburnians (initials)
- 40** A baptized child which dies within its first month named after the white mantle used at baptism and after death as a shroud
- 42** μ
- 43** Excellent fabric store in Lygon Street, East Brunswick with distinctive retro logo on bag
- 44** German artist known for enormous paintings of stick figures surrounded by scrawls which look like anyone could have done it
- 46** Bavarian village known for famous decennial Passion Play (and woodcarving)

- 1** "Go placidly amid the noise and haste" 1927 inspirational prose poem by Max Ehrmann recited by talk show host Les Crane in 1971 spoken-word hit single (also Leonard Nimoy as *Spock Thoughts*)
- 2** Iconic New York hipster (*Metal Machine Music* etc.)
- 3** Jewish village in Eastern Europe or Russia
- 4** McMahan, Koch, Snowden, Wood, Mister

- 5** Possessing a dark, confronting quality, often alluding fearlessly to uncomfortable truths such as in a Nick Cave song
- 6** Infinitely repeating geometrical form due to component parts being the same as the whole which looks like paisley
- 7** Veteran US actor known for roles as Marty, "Fatso" Judson, Roo, Major General Worden, Dutch Engstrom and Quinton McHale (also unnamed centurion in Bible story whose sick sex-slave was healed by Jesus in mini-series) (initials)
- 8** Dead body, corpse
- 9** Subdue by non-lethal electric shock utilizing controversial US law enforcement pain compliance device ("Don't ... me, bro!")
- 14** New Labour *or* Nathan Leopold (initials)
- 16** Lurid, populist Nazi-era tabloid published by Julius Streicher known for vehemently anti-Semitic editorials and cartoons (invoked to impugn motives of cartoonists critical of Israel such as Leunig) (3, 7)
- 19** 18th century scientific theory also known as animal magnetism which claimed animate beings inc. humans, animals and vegetables possess an invisible natural force named lebensmagnetismus in the form of "magnetic fluid" which could be used therapeutically by a "magnetizer" (discredited)
- 20** Weapon used in conjunction with trident and dagger by *retarius* gladiator on epic theatre
- 22** Nazi leader imprisoned by British in 1941 (after abortive mission to broker peace) then Russians in 1946 (after Nuremberg verdict) until death by strangulation in 1987
- 25** Small component in large machine
- 26** The room where the Last Supper took place
- 27** Iran embargo *or* Internet Explorer (initials)
- 28** Nightmarish Japanese ritual suicide
- 33** Air
- 37** "I'll stay on the bus, forget about ... Put the blame on me" *Tie a Yellow Ribbon Round the Ole Oak Tree*
- 38** "There is always Until they are ready to bring us to the cemetery and bury us" Vladimir Putin
- 39** "No man does it all by himself / I said, young man, put your pride on the shelf etc." *Village People* song with touching vision of human solidarity (not *In the Navy*)
- 41** Roller Girls of the Apocalypse (abbrev.)
- 43** Initials shared by greatly loved creators of *Jane Eyre* and *The Gong Show*
- 45** Nazi Germany *or* Noel (or Norm) Gallagher (initials)
